TES – ATEA TEACHER EDUCATOR OF THE YEAR 2021

The aim of the TES- ATEA Teacher Educator of the Year Award is to encourage and recognise the innovative teaching practices of a teacher educator at university level. Nominations will be accepted from scholars whose primary activity is teaching in undergraduate or postgraduate Teacher Education.

Written applications of no more than five pages in total (not including testimonial/s) should address the selection criteria listed below. Applications close on May 30, 2021.

SELECTION CRITERIA

In no more than five pages (not including testimonials), the applicant should:

- Demonstrate their capacity to develop and incorporate learning and teaching innovation(s) or initiative(s) through, e.g., an innovation in a curriculum area; an inventive or powerful assessment approach; or a cogent professional development initiative
- Provide their career highlights and academic story which demonstrates experience and innovative teaching practice.
- Provide a short case study (max. 500 words) outlining this/these learning and teaching innovation(s) or initiative(s)
- Provide evidence of impact of this/these learning and teaching innovation(s) or initiative(s) on student learning
- Include a maximum of two (2) testimonials (of no more than one A4 page each) in support of the learning and teaching innovation(s) or initiative(s)

The applicant should include their name, title, institution, role and contact details in the application. The applicant should also include their ATEA membership number

AWARD

The TES - ATEA Teacher Educator of the Year award recipient will receive:

- Framed certificate: TES - ATEA Teacher Educator of the Year Award, presented at the 2021 conference dinner
- \$5000 courtesy of TES
- Complimentary registration to 2021 ATEA Conference (includes ATEA membership for 2021-22 financial year) (Total value \$5600)

CONDITIONS

- The applicant must be currently employed at an Australian university.
- The teacher education innovation presented should have taken place within an Australian University within the last two years (2019-2020)
- The recipient is expected to attend and present their innovation(s) or initiative(s) at the 2021 ATEA conference to be held in Brisbane. An abstract will be requested from the successful recipient after the award has been decided.

ATEA EARLY CAREER RESEARCHER GRANT 2021

The ATEA Early Career Researcher Grant is to support an early career researcher (ECR) to develop their capacity by encouraging them to work on a project based around teacher education. The grant will support a research project that can be completed in a one-year time frame from July 2021, in line with the annual ATEA national conference. The recipient of the grant will present the outcomes of their research project at the 2022 conference.

A grant of \$2000 for research support, as well as complimentary registration for the 2022 ATEA Conference will be awarded to the successful applicant. The total value of the grant (money and conference registration) is \$2600.

The successful applicant will be required to present their work at the 2022 ATEA conference and, on completion of the project, is encouraged to seek publication of their work in the Association's journal, the *Asia-Pacific Journal of Teacher Education (APJTE)*. Submitted articles will be subject to the regular APJTE review process.

Applications close on May 30, 2021.

PROPOSAL

In no more than four pages, please provide the following information:

- 1. The applicant's name and title; role and institution; contact details**
- 2. Date of completion of PhD, or other explanation, to demonstrate ECR status**
- 3. Project title**
- 4. Project summary**
- 5. Research question(s)**
- 6. Research background, rationale and significance.** The context of the research; the background to the research; consideration of relevant background literature; how the project will contribute to pre- or in-service teacher professional learning
- 7. Conceptual and/or theoretical framework.** A brief account of how the research study will be conceptualised and/or theorised
- 8. Research method.** A description of how the research question will be explored; what types of data will be collected and used; and how the data will be analysed and the findings presented
- 9. Ethics approval(s),** if relevant Identify any ethics approval/s that are required, and who is responsible for organising these approvals
- 10. Timeframe.** How the project will be completed in a one-year timeframe from July, in line with the annual ATEA conference
- 11. Budget.** Indicate how the funds awarded will be used to support the research

GRANT INFORMATION

The ATEA Early Career Researcher Grant recipient will receive:

- Framed Certificate: ATEA Early Career Researcher Grant, presented at the 2021 Conference dinner
- \$2000 courtesy of ATEA
- Complimentary registration at the 2022 ATEA Conference (includes ATEA membership for 2022-23 financial year) (Total value \$2600)

CONDITIONS

- The applicant must be an early career researcher. ECR researchers are those who have been awarded a doctorate within 5 years, or longer if combined with periods of significant career interruption.

- The successful applicant must attend the 2022 ATEA conference and present a paper on their research.
- Payment to each grant recipient will be forwarded on receipt of an invoice from the individual or their institution.
